Are you aware that three opportunities for Faith Development are underway this Lenten Season? On Sunday's at 10:30, you could join a Bible Study Group. On Monday's at 7:00 pm, a group meets using the Little Black Book. Finally, on Wednesday mornings, a group attends the 8am mass and meets afterward to discuss the readings for the upcoming Sunday. All meetings take place in the Holy family Meeting Room off the vestibule of the church. All are welcome. That's 10:30 on Sunday's, 7pm on Monday's, 8am on Wednesday's.
